3.	Infrastructure Investment Plan (IIP)	
	The main proposed amendment from the 2023 version of the 2023-2026 IIP is a decrease in the CIL allocation to IIP005 - Walking and Cycling Improvements. This is a result of a decrease in the forecast level of CIL receipts during the period 2024/25 and 2025/26, based on the expected level of development commencing in the borough.
